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# Introduction

The following pages contain images of the volume entitled “Highland Board of Health Records” as found in the offices of the Charter Township of Highland, Oakland County, Michigan. With the kind assistance and cooperation of Mary L. McDonnell, Highland Township Clerk, the Highland Township Historical Society scanned this volume in December, 2014, and prepared this accompanying Introduction and Index.

## The Original Record

The original records are contained in a small ledger measuring 6.25 by 7.5 inches (“octavo” size). Its faintly ruled pages are case bound in pasteboard covers decorated with marbled paper and finished with a leather spine (i.e., quarter bound) bearing faint traces of gilt trim. The contents cover the period from April 10, 1849, to March 22, 1949 - roughly 100 years – with records for the last several years written on the volume’s front inside cover and flyleaf.

The overall condition of the original record is “very good.” The binding is still relatively tight and all the signatures are intact. The covers show the scuffing and edge-wear expected for a volume seeing a century of use. The individual pages show some discoloration, but remain flexible. One page (Image 83) has some tearing in the middle due to the fact that a large folded poster has been glued on the reverse side and places stress on the page when turned. Such tearing does not, however, affect the legibility of the text. The ink used in many of the entries prior to 1900 has begun to fade and was often written with a fine steel point making these entries somewhat more difficult to read.

## The Scans

Each page of the original record book (including the front and back covers) was scanned in color at 600 dpi, with both contrast and shadow adjusted to enhance legibility. The resulting .jpg images were then straightened, cropped and subjected to an “auto-contrast” routine. Note that these adjustments result in the paper appearing slightly more “yellow” than is in fact the case.

## The Index

The individual pages of the original record book are unnumbered. So too, several of the last entries were written on the front inside cover and flyleaf. For such reasons the index presented here is keyed to the image number. The one blank/unused page (on the reverse side of Image 4) is *not* included among these scans.

# INDEX

The usefulness of any historical or genealogical record frequently depends on the quality of its index. In addition to listing every personal name and topic, a good index should include short descriptions for each entry so that items of particular interest can be quickly found without the need to consult multiple pages. While this naturally results in an index of greater length, the benefits undoubtedly outweigh the disadvantages. This is why, for example, there are multiple entries for the same individual differing only as to the year in which the reference is made, or the office which the individual then held.

Note that many of the original Board of Health records do not include an individual's first name, initials and/or title. Where these are known (or reasonably deduced) from other sources, however, they are included in the index entry. Under Michigan law, for example, a township's Board of Health consisted of its Supervisor, Justices of the Peace, Health Officer (if any) and Township Clerk. Since the Clerk typically signed the minutes, his/her position is usually clear. In most cases such minutes also identify the Supervisor as such. Most Health Officers can likewise be identified either through the record of their appointment and/or use of the titles "Dr." or "M. D." It can therefore be assumed all other Board members mentioned in such minutes were most likely Justices of the Peace. Where uncertainty exists, however, such persons are simply identified as "BoH Member."

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*\*\*\* Note \*\*\**

*Both Charles Barnett and Earl C. Barrett served as Justices of the Peace (and thus members of the Board of Health) in the late 1920s and early 1930s. Unfortunately, the minutes often fail to give a first name or initial, and the two last names appear similar when written in hand. Those interested in either should thus consult the entries under both names to determine for themselves which was meant.*

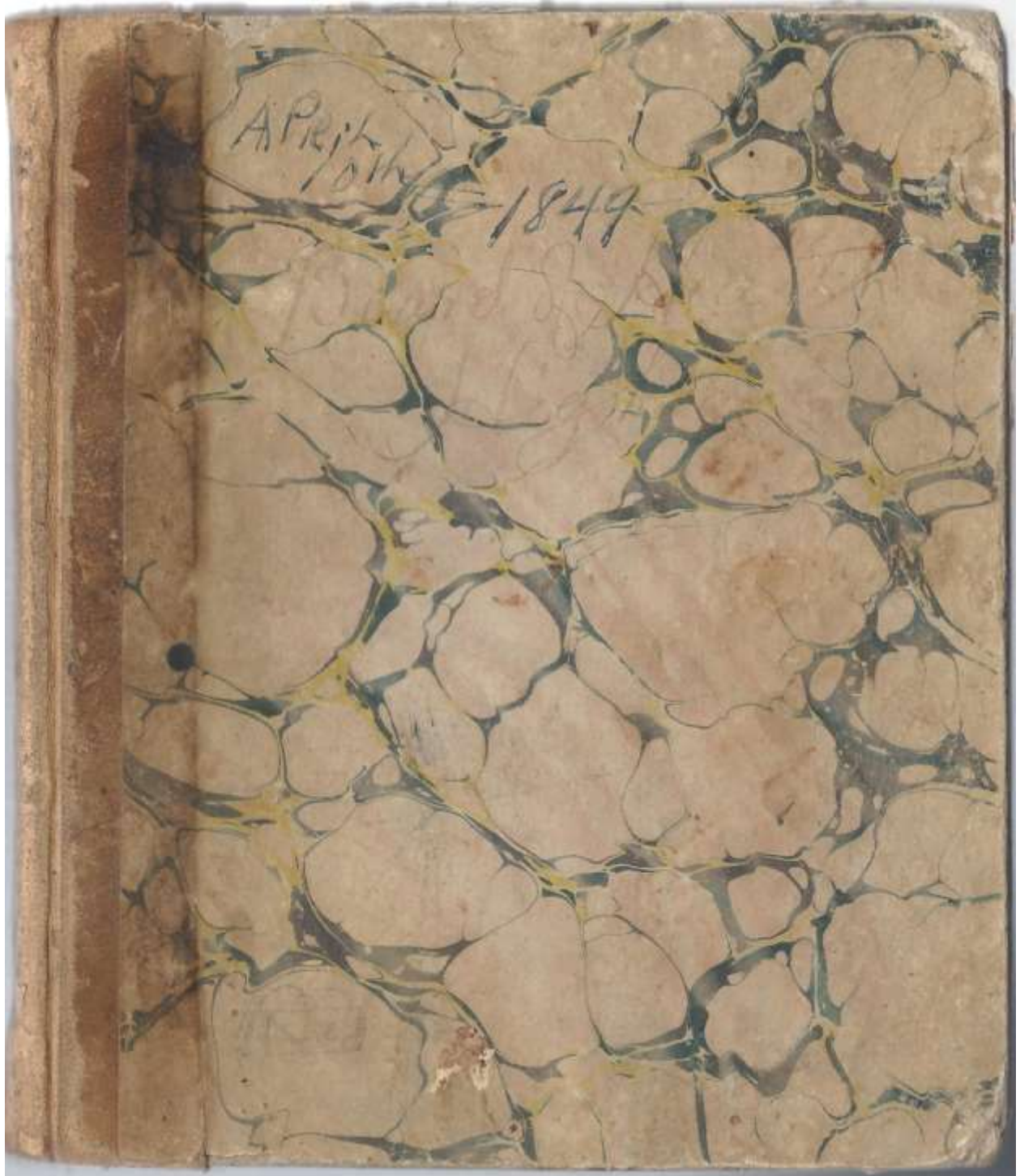

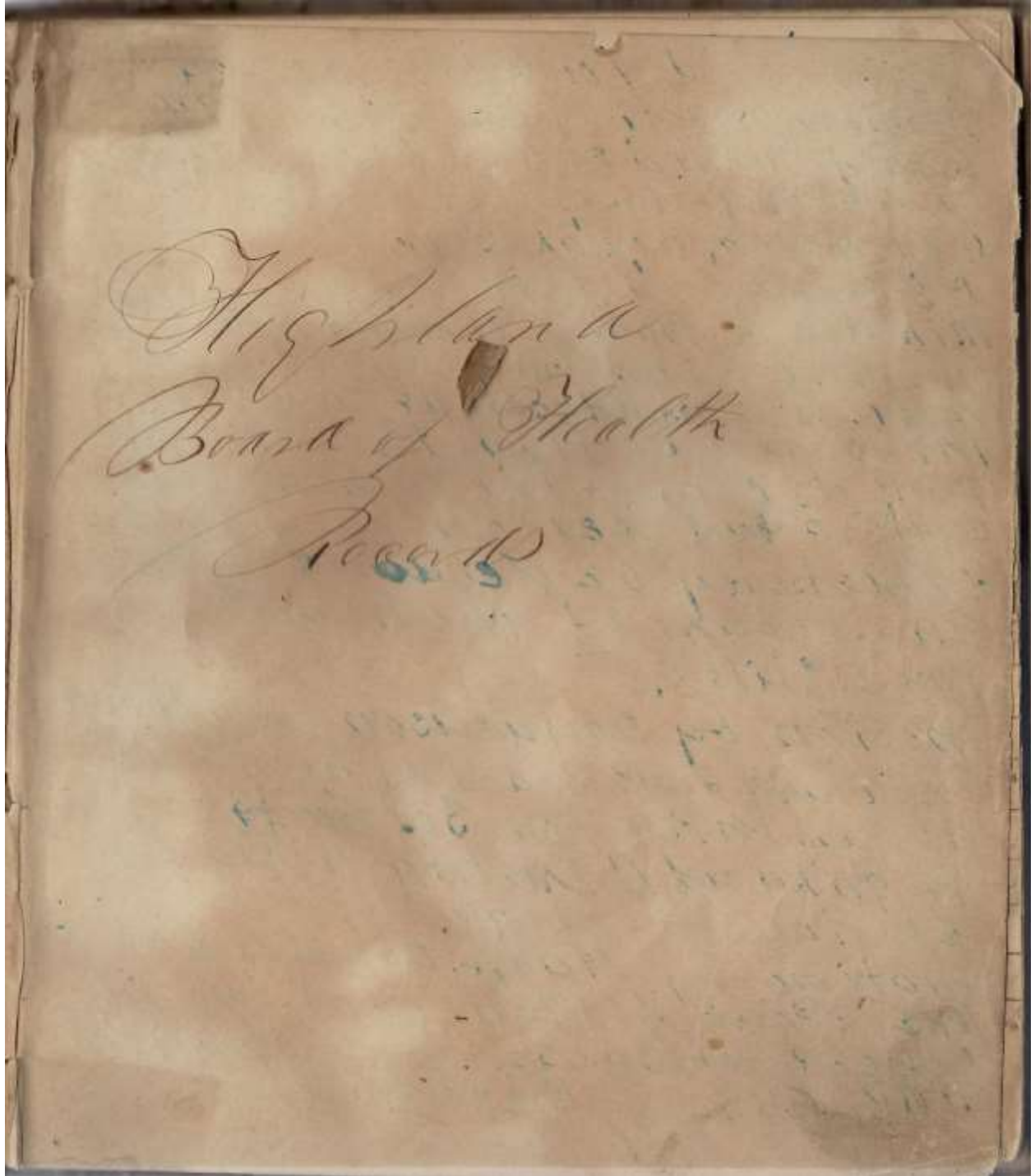

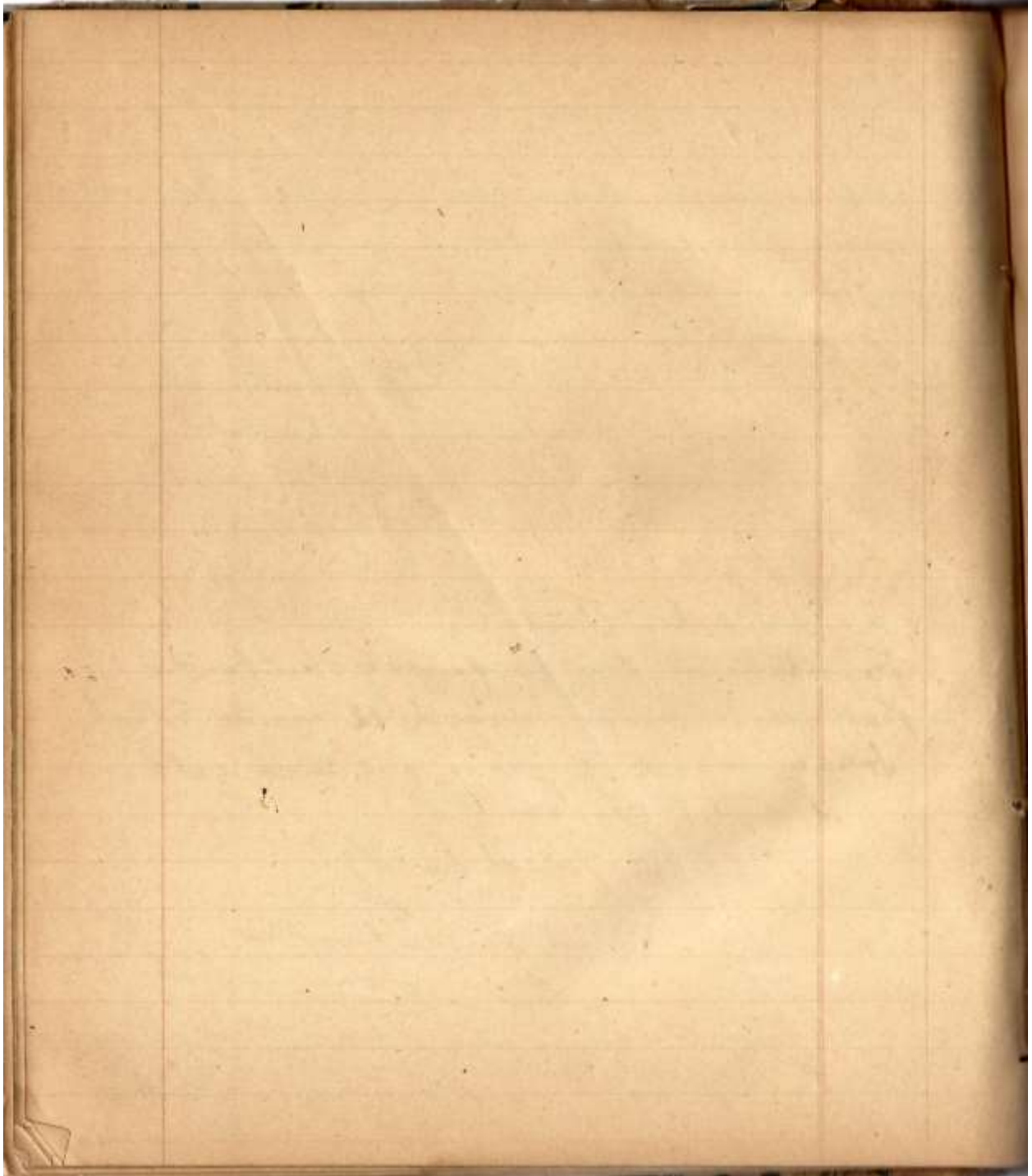

# NOTICE

Regulations of the Board of Health of the Township of Highland, Oakland County, Michigan, relative to infected persons, animals and substances.

Except by permission of the health officer, no person shall enter or depart from, and no article shall be removed from any residence or other place in which any person sick or infected with a dangerous communicable disease has been ordered to remain by the local health officer or the local board of health.

No person sick with diphtheria, scarlet fever (scarletina, scarlet rash, rash fever), smallpox, or any other dangerous communicable disease; no corpse of a person dead from one of the above named diseases, or from any other dangerous communicable disease; no person who has lately had any such disease; no person who has been with the dead or living body of a person infected with any such disease, or in a room or place occupied by such a body; and no animal or article which has been infected, exposed to the infection, or is liable to propagate or convey the infection of any dangerous communicable disease, shall be moved about, removed therefrom, or be brought within this township or go or be carried out of this township, without the special permit and direction of the health officer or the board of health thereof.

The foregoing regulations shall remain in force until revoked by the board of health of this township.

Whoever violates a foregoing regulation incurs the penalty of the law.

Permits for the removal of infected persons, animals, or articles, in accordance with law, may be granted by this board, and, when the board is not in session, by the health officer, under circumstances and conditions as recommended by the State Board of Health.
